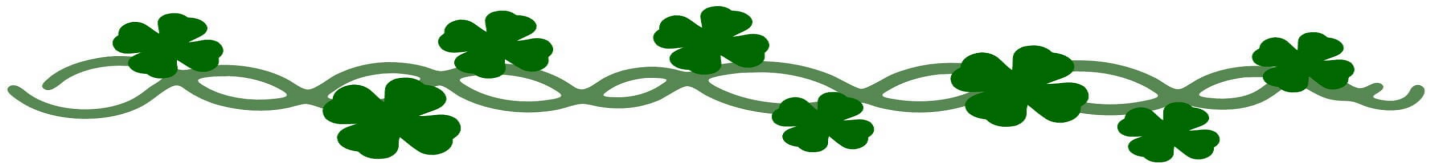

Thank you to our parent drivers and school visitors for understanding and following restrictions on parking lot access.

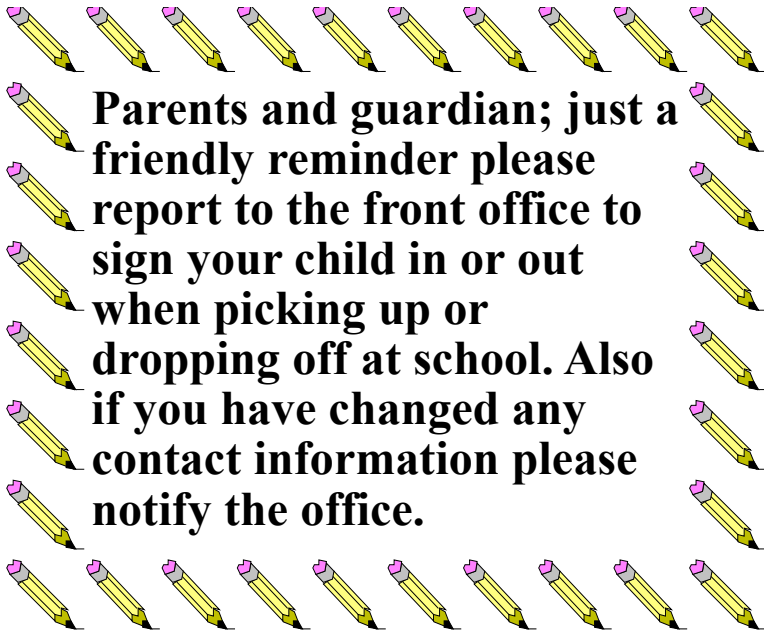
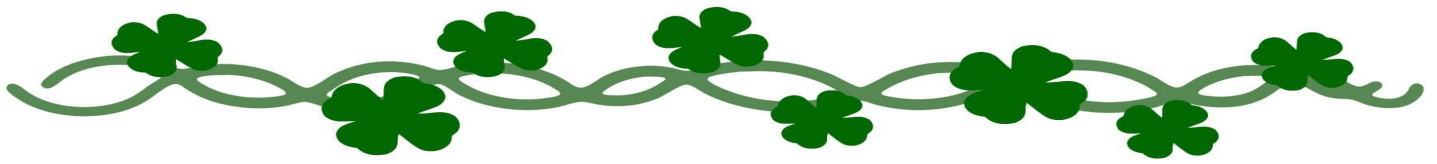
Recently we added a visual reminder that visitor parking should not be in front of the school between 8:15-8:45am and also 3:15-3:45pm.

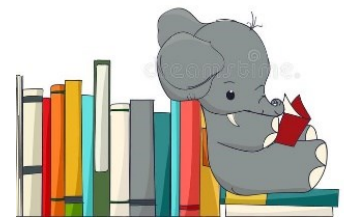

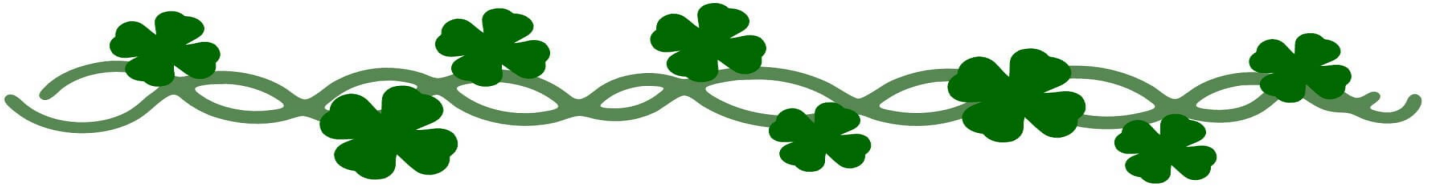

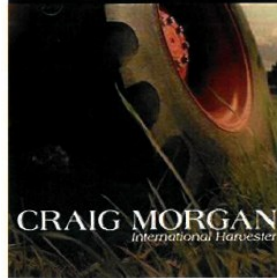
