Principal's Message

The 2022-23 school year is around the corner! While 2021-22 has been another tricky year to navigate in our building I am proud to say that our staff and students have done everything asked of them to stay safe and healthy throughout the Covid-19 response. As we have settled back into traditional learning experiences in the school everyone seems to be picking up where they left off. We have people learning in a wide variety of ways with the goal of allowing each student to learn in the way that suits them best.

As we head into summer I would ask that parents continue to monitor the mental health and wellness of their children through this time. Aside from the pandemic response which has been a mental drain on everyone there have been several tragedies connected to education in the last month which previous generations of students did not know of, let alone have details available to them, the way that they do now. In many cases mental distress in students as young as 10 years of age are being reported. This is due in no small part to the unprecedented access that younger children now have to uncensored and detailed descriptions of school based tragedies in the United States. That being said we know our students are well supported by families and loved ones and so this message is just a reminder that our "littles" may need us in ways that we did not a generation or two ago.

On a lighter note we will move into 2022-23 with ongoing developments to our playground and outdoor classroom, within the school our Sensory-Regulation Room will also continue to develop with support from SRPSD and our associated consultants/coaches as well. The new school year will be the first to start without restrictions and we look forward to the continued return of parents to our school for special events and even just saying hi during pickups/drop-offs!

As the school year winds down we also prepare for the inevitable changes that come with a new school year upcoming. For the first time in 14 years Teacher Lisa Campbell will not be with us for the fall startup, she is moving on to Ecole Vickers School for a new start! Lisa has supported students of Red Wing in many ways over her years, most recently serving as our Art Show "Curator", SLC Staff Liaison and SCC Member. We will miss Lisa's contributions to the school and know that Vickers is luck to have her going forward.

We will also bid farewell to Penny Stupnikoff-Watchel; Penny is retiring this year following her years at Red Wing as our Education Support Teacher. Mrs. S-W (as she's known to the kids) has supported our staff and students in many ways over the years and will be missed. Jan Semchuk is also retiring after 15 years (!) as our Library Technician at Red Wing. Mr. Semchuk leaves big shoes to fill as her love of books and reading has been contagious for our students in all the years I have known her!

Social Worker Delores Pocha has also been reassigned to a new school. Delores' office has been a haven for many students over her years at Red Wing and we know that her experience and expertise will be missed at Red Wing but beneficial at her new school going forward.

Finally, Mrs. Lohneis is also moving on to a new teaching challenge as the Band Director at Ecole Vickers School in Prince Albert. Mrs. Lohneis has given our students a wonderful experience as Prairie Wind Band Director the past 3 years; including student performances that have garnered awards and prizes throughout the group. She leaves behind a group of students with a love of music and understanding of what is possible when you don't mind editing videos until 3am!

We thank all of our staff for their service to the school and wish them well in the future.

In their place we will welcome the following staff members. Kelci Grimard will be our new Library Tech to be joined by Casey Ling (Band/Music), Jessica Pocha and Brette Korpan as teachers in our building. Some teaching assignments have to be finalized for the fall but at this point we believe staffing is now complete for our building. Our new Social Worker will be Angela Reinbrecht, we are fortunate to have Angela an extra day in our school every 2 weeks due to an increase in SW allocation to our school. We will continue to move forward with a centralized school Math goal as which we will continue to support with an embedded Math Literacy Coach. This role is expected to be filled by Mrs. Morash again next year.

Mrs. Morley and myself will also continue in our roles as In-School Administrators for 2022-23! YAY!!! As we work back towards some of the traditional spring activities at the school it is worth noting that all classes will be traveling for some sort of class trip, including our June 16th trip to the Kinsmen Water Park for the students in K-3. Our Gr. 5-8 students will have the opportunity to qualify for the P4A Meet in later May/early June. The Kindergartens will also get a traditional celebration of their first year in school with a celebration on June 24th.

Our Grade 8s are also planning to go back to Camp Kadesh for an overnight stay for the first time in 2 years, that will also be followed by their Gr. 8 Farewell on June 14. A special thanks is owed to this Gr. 8 class as they have mainly been together since Kindergarten at Red Wing and have consistently been a wonderful group of students to work with. We wish them all the best in the future and know they will represent Red Wing well in their high school careers and beyond.

The school year will wrap up with our Play Day taking place on the final day of classes, June 28th. We are excited to try this event on the last day of school 2022 and welcome parents/guardians to join.

Thank you again from all of us at Red Wing Public School for entrusting your treasures to us each and every day. We look forward to doing it all again next year and in the meantime wish you all the best summer possible!!!




Hi Red Wing Parents and Students.....I wanted to take this opportunity to say good-bye.
