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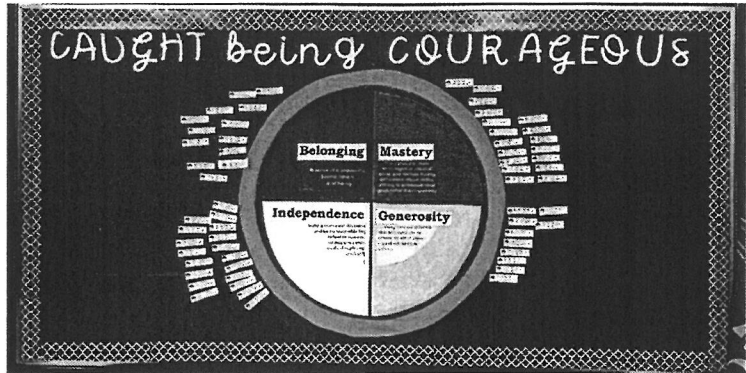

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## Principal's Message

Support for our literacy focused school goal has settled in with the use of the UFLI and Heggerty literacy support programs. These are programs that have been adopted across SRPSD, and are also being used nationally and internationally as well. These programs are used in concert with focused educational methods and applied to suit the many differing needs of our students.

Another initiative we are excited to share is our Caught being Courageous campaign where students engaging in positive acts are acknowledged based on our Circle of Courage model. This model is in support of our citizenship goal for all students and is supported daily in our classrooms where teachers encourage the four pillars of the model; Generosity, Belonging, Independence and Mastery. When students are observed demonstrating evidence of these pillars they are given a CbC ticket which is then displayed on the bulletin board outside the office. We look forward to filling this board and the school-wide celebration that will come once that has occurred!



This month our students continue to enjoy our unlimited and free use of the NRRC Arenas next door. We can never say enough times how thankful we are to the Board of NRRC to continuing to allow us this access. As we headed into our skating schedule this year our Red Wing SCC has graciously donated new "skate trainers" to the arena. Our younger students without a lot of skating experience enjoy the opportunity to learn this new (and difficult!) skill with the aid of the trainers. We extend thank you to this group for having done that as well.

March also saw our students in Grade 5-8 travel to Wapiti Ski Valley on March 6<sup>th</sup> for their annual ski trip. While some money is asked from students to participate the trip is heavily subsidized by our annual Walkathon, allowing us to travel in style by taking highway coach buses for the trip!
