



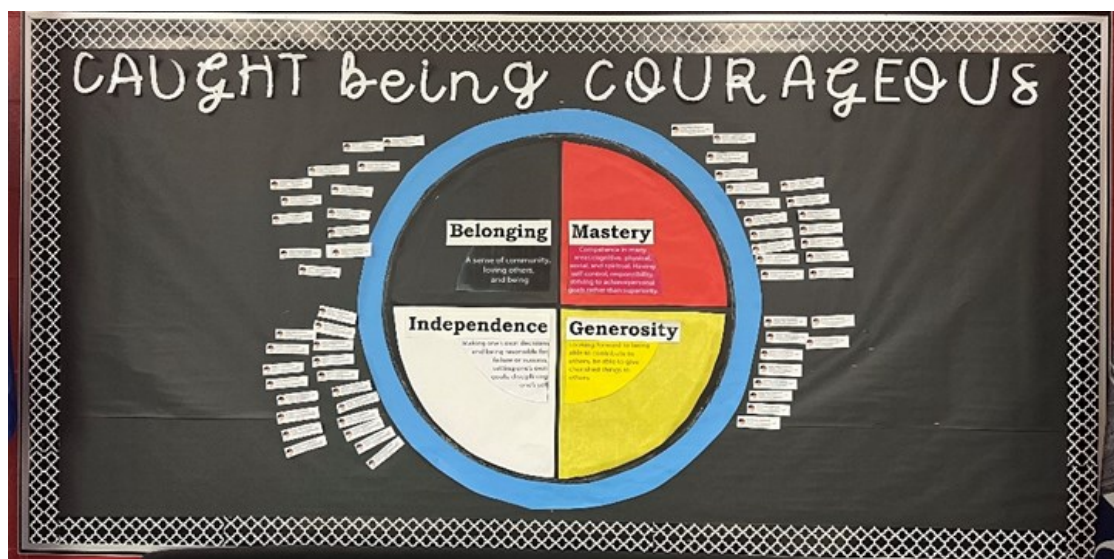

As our students travel their own paths we aim to celebrate successes along the way.

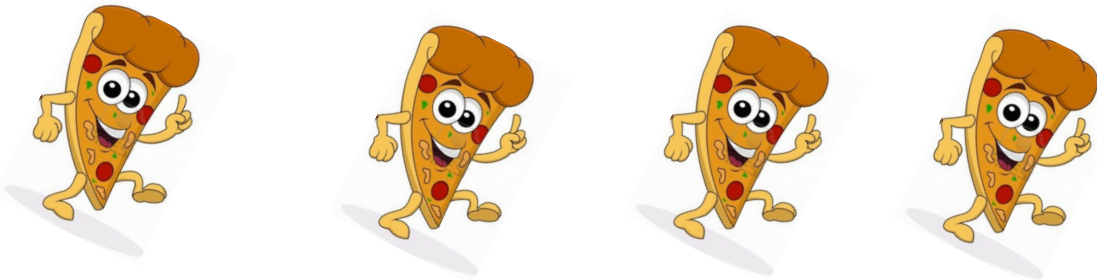
Caught being Courageous is our way to catch kids doing good things and reward them with the appropriate coupon which will then be placed on the billboard in the foyer across from the office.
