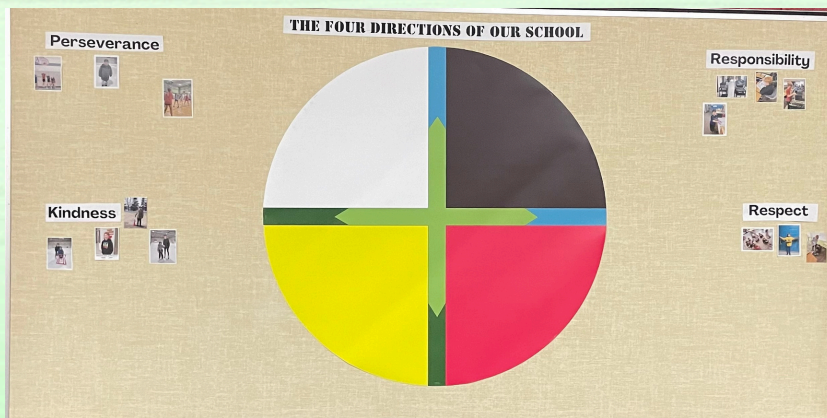

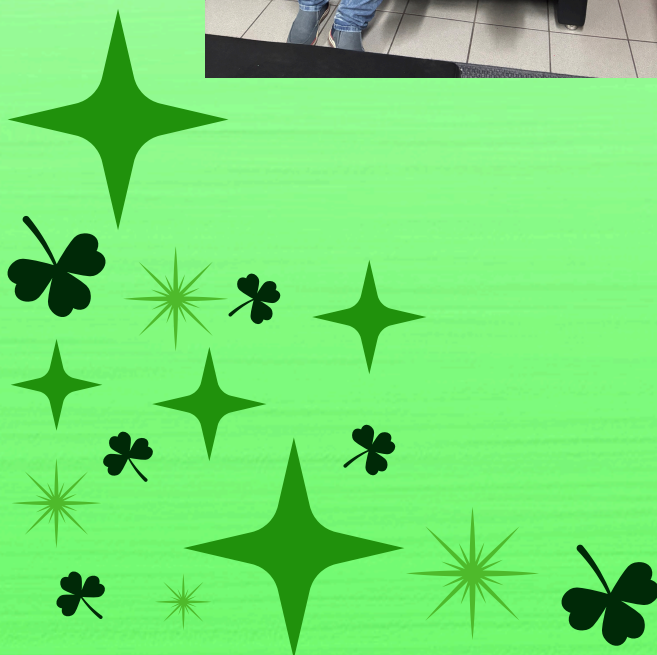
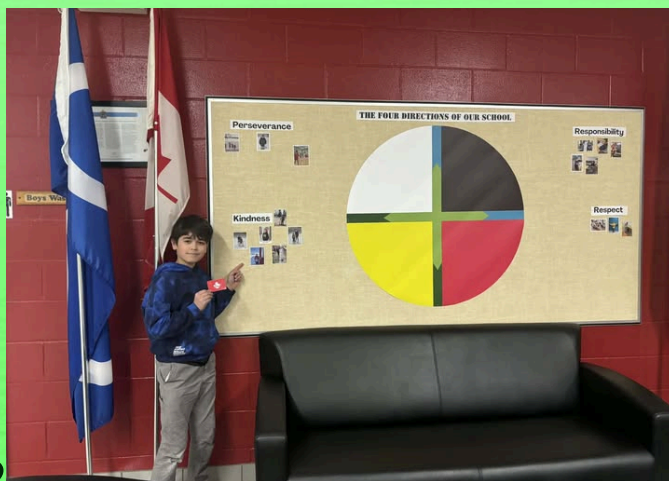

# Understanding the Zones of Regulation

This year, students at our school are learning about the Zones of Regulation—a simple, child-friendly framework that helps children understand their emotions, energy levels, and how to manage them.

The Zones of Regulation organizes feelings and levels of alertness into four colour-coded zones:



All zones are normal and expected—there are no “bad” zones. The goal is not to stay in the Green Zone all day, but to help children recognize how they are feeling and learn strategies to move themselves into a zone that helps them learn, play, and problem-solve.

In classrooms, students are taught to:

- Notice and name how they are feeling
- Understand how their body feels in different zones
- Practice calming and regulating strategies (such as breathing, movement, or taking a break)

You may hear your child say things like, “I’m in the Yellow Zone” or “I need a calming tool.” This means they are learning to self-identify their emotions and choose a healthy way to manage them.

Families can support this learning at home by:

- Talking about feelings in everyday moments
- Using the zone colours to describe emotions
- Practicing calming strategies together

When children learn to understand and regulate their emotions, they build skills for focus, friendships, problem-solving, and lifelong mental wellness.
